### Director's Report for 8-4-2021

Well it's almost August and it seems like the story is the same....We're busy. From Drop-off sites, to HHW, to composting, to outreach we are firing on all cylinders and keeping even more material out of the landfill. The most obvious is that the Georgia Site is noticeably busier than it was this time last year. However the remote sites remain busier than ever too, but much closer to normal than the Georgia site.

At our drop-off sites we have had an easier summer staffing than in past years. This is good news especially in the face of the current job market which would certainly make it difficult to find help if we were in immediate need. We have been successful with having more full-time staff as well as more part time staff that work close to 30 hours per week. We rotate staff between sites more often and have a few more attendants on staff in preparation for cancelations, time off, and illnesses. This step has led to staff retention and better employees all around. We frequently say that the crew we have now is, on the whole, the best we've had.

The Morse Industrial Park stormwater retention pond which we share with the whole office park is being redesigned to meet new stormwater standards and at the same time the problems that led to the clogged discharge and breach of the earth dam will be fixed. The Park association is working with the state to understand the changes that must be made. This cost will be shared equally by all park members. Second, we are moving forward on getting the gutters on the south side of the warehouse repaired. This work should be complete by November.

As for the Facility renovation plan, we will have a final site plan and Cross will offer a gross probable construction cost with the site plan. We have a breakdown of the gross cost estimate including a cost for extending Cross' contract to engage in permitting. This is attached and will be reviewed at the meeting. The RFP for Construction Manager has been released and we will have responses for our meeting in September.

In June I reported that the district's plastic diversion program shipped just over 40,000 pounds. Well, last week we shipped another 50,000 pounds of plastic. Part of the load was over 500,000 Polycarbonate spouts from maple producers around the state. This shipment also included boat wrap, maple tubing, bale wrap, and household plastic that isn't recyclable through the CSWD MRF (think laundry baskets, plastic lawn furniture, tool boxes, etc.) We continue to be excited with the increasing volume of plastic we can divert from the landfill. Unfortunately, there remains a great deal that still makes its way there, so it remains important that we build our plastic recycling programs and promote decreased plastic use.

In HHW news, the summer has started off with a bang. There has been a noticeable increase in the number of households that participate in our HHW program, but a decrease in the number of large truckloads and instances of "I've been saving this stuff for 20 years." It's good to know that being open more often and being more convenient encourages people to get rid of Hazardous substances regularly. We have held three collection events so far this year and numbers at those events were higher than normal (over 60 households per event.) We are heading into the second half of our HHW events of the summer with just three events remaining in Montgomery, North Hero, and St. Albans Town. We have instituted a better appointment system that is imbedded in our website and has a calendar feature that will allow residents to make their own appointments online which should reduce the administrative burden here at the office.



The Northwest Vermont Solid Waste Management District is planning an expansion project at their facility on Morse Drive, in the Town of Georgia, VT. This project involves the construction of a 700 square-foot office addition, a new, 2-story 1200 sf office space and storage building, a warehouse addition, multiple locations for additional concrete infrastructure and significant site re-organization to meet improved material management. Site driveways and parking will be added to more efficiently organize the traffic flow into and out of the project. This facility serves the public and space is limited. Site work and construction must be managed within the facility operations.

The Solid Waste District is interested in soliciting construction management proposals for construction of the project. The estimated project value is \$1,000,000. The overall concept is shown on Cross Consulting Engineers' drawings which are attached to this request.

### BACKGROUND

The Solid Waste District has retained the services of Cross Consulting Engineers, PC to design and permit the project.

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

A new 700 sf office expansion will occur on the front (east) side of the building. This expansion will include a new visitor's entrance and new office space. A new 1200 sf storage building with second story office space will be constructed at the rear of the property.

The project will include two new small parking areas in front of the building. Approximately 16 new parking spaces will be added. This work will include landscaping and lighting.

The project will also include a new public driveway entrance and pay booth to access the drop off area in back of and inside the building, using the rear overhead door. This new driveway will be on the south side of the property.

There will also be other site modifications to re-organize the dumpsters and roll-offs that are located on site to more efficiently organize the site layout of this facility. New concrete slabs and walls will be required to support these containers.

### SERVICES REQUIRED

The Construction Manager will be required to bid out and manage the project, subject to the following:

a) Single construction project most likely to start in July 2022.

b) All subcontracts shall be bid out to at least three reputable subcontractors. The owner reserves the right to add or delete subcontractor's names to create a preapproved bid list.

Construction management services will include the following:

1) Preconstruction Services – This includes up to eight (8) in person meetings with the Owner and design team to provide input on design questions, construction cost estimates of alternatives, overall construction budget estimates and preparation of a project schedule with updates as necessary. Two interim and one final cost estimate shall be prepared. The final cost estimate will be prepared upon completion of the construction documents. Preconstruction services are expected to commence September 15, 2021 and end on July 15, 2022.

2) Bid Phase Services - The Construction Manager will subcontract all aspects of the project by obtaining at least three competitive bids for each trade utilizing the plans and specifications prepared by the design team. If the Construction Manager wishes to perform selected services with their own forces, they must identify this work early in the scope of the project and obtain permission from the Owner. The Construction Manager will solicit all bids, de-scope all bids, prepare bid tabulations for review with the Owner and make recommendations on the subcontractors to be hired for each discipline.

3) Construction Phase Services – Provide project management and supervisory personnel and laborers to adequately manage and run the project in a manner that will ensure that the project schedule and budget are being met. The Construction Manager will manage the entire project and associated site work through completion of punch list and furnishing post construction as-built drawings, owner manuals and warranties. All subcontracts will be with the Construction Manager and there shall be a single Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) contract between the Construction Manager and the Owner. The Construction Manager will provide a GMP proposal when most of the costs have been determined through the solicitation of bids, but no later than one month prior to the anticipated construction start date.
