NWSWD Board of Supervisors Meeting And Annual Election of the Board

April 2, 2025

The Board of Supervisors of the Northwest Vermont Solid Waste Management District held their regularly scheduled board meeting on April 2, 2025, via zoom (noted) and at the St. Albans City Hall Council Chambers at 6:34PM.

Full Board Meeting

Acting Chair Jennifer Getty welcomed all to the board and called the meeting to order at 6:30PM. Alex McCracken was noted as the new representative for Alburgh and introductions were made.

- 1) Agenda Review-Additions/Deletions: None
- 2) Opportunity for Public Comment: None
- 3) Approval of Minutes for February 11, 2025. Al Voegele made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Jared Blade seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed with two abstentions, Alex McCracken and Jim Richards.
- 4) Staff Reports:
 - a) Directors Report:

John Leddy noted the following:

- The expansion project is moving along quite nicely, slab has been poured, doors still need to go in, the recycling commodity storage addition is nearly complete and the HHW collection area and office moving along on schedule.
- A Steel price increase in relation to the project is being discussed with Rearch and is still under discussion. Still the project is running very close to the quoted price.

• The Rotary Club of St. Albans is interested in partnering in the collection of plastic film. They want to go out to businesses and manufacturers and collect in a big way. Discussions are on going. Discussion ensued.

b) Finance Report:

Pam Bolster noted the following:

- Drop off site news. February was a difficult month for drop off site income and users but March has shown improvement.
- A reminder that the board had approved the principal of the bonds to be paid from reserved fund for FY25.
- GA Project Grant reimbursement requests totally 173K have been submitted
- The District took possession of the 500K bond for the building project in March.
- A brief review of the finances for the building project.
- The audit company has sent "warning" notification of increased rates for the next contract round due to the time required to complete municipal audits.
- The P&L Accrual through 3.31.2025 was briefly reviewed.
- Noted that Jaime Tibbitts had resigned as chair and from the board, effective immediately.

5) New Business:

a. Election of Officers

i. Annual Election of the Officers, Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, Clerk.

Jennifer Getty asked for nominations for chair. Al Voegele nominated Jennifer Getty. Jared Blake seconded the nomination. No other nominations.

Jennifer Getty nominated April St. Francis for vice chair. Bob Buermann seconded the nomination.

Pam Bolster was nominated as Clerk and John Ledd was nominated as Treasurer.

Bob Buermann made a motion to close nominations. Alex McCracken seconded. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Bob Buermann made a motion for the clerk to place one vote for the slate. Alex McCracken Seconded. All were in favor and the motion passed.

The Clerk submitted one vote for each nomination and it is approved.

ii. Set Annual Meeting Calendar.

The meeting schedule was reviewed and approved to continue as is. Meetings occur the first Wednesday of February, April, June, August, October, November and December.

iii. Committee Review.

Ms. Bolster read the focus of each committee and noted each committee should have at least three members. She reviewed current committee members, asked for volunteers and said she would send the overview of each committee to all and if they wish to volunteer that would be great. An updated list with all volunteers will be updated and sent as well.

Terms of members and vacant seats were discussed with Pam Bolster noting that letters went out to the Towns offering assistance from the District to find people if they would like.

b. VOTE: Municipal Tire Program Extension

The municipal tire program was discussed, noting the 10K that was allocated previously had run out. John Leddy suggested 2K be allocated for FY25 as an extension to the program, noting Green Up Day was approaching. Discussion ensued. Bob Buermann made a motion to approve 2K from Reserve Funds to continue the program. Alex McCracken seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Meeting adjourned 7:40PM

The renovation/expansion of the Georgia Recycling Facility has entered the final stages. In the past couple of months, the project progressed mostly on schedule. However, there were a couple of curveballs to contend with. The only notable one being the native soils at the back of the property and the intrusion of groundwater as they were prepping the area for concrete. The solution was to over excavate the area and import extra stone to help the area drain better. The fix worked and all concrete was poured on-site. The paving takes place this week and the project should be wrapped up in three weeks. I would like to have some sort of ribbon cutting in July to celebrate the completion of the project and look for your input.

In HHW news the summer has started off with a bang. We knew that HHW program usage has been increasing steadily at the Georgia facility and this spring's usage showed no end to that trend. We have held three remote collection events so far this year and numbers at those events have been slightly higher than in recent years. This year's events have served between 50-70 households per event.

It is time for us to complete our fourth year of reporting to the state on implementation of our Solid Waste Implementation Plan (SWIP) which was effective 2021. Over the next month we will be pulling together the data needed to report to the state on the past year (2024) of SWIP implementation. We will report on our waste disposal and diversion for the whole District, a report of all the collection programs we offer to our residents, and all our outreach and education efforts.

Over the next month we will also be writing a Draft of our next SWIP. This draft will be submitted to the state at the end of the month and then pre-approved. Once we have this pre-approval we will need to hold two public hearings on it and then have full board approval before the end of the year. This Plan is completed to conform with a template that the state provides and it's best for all concerned that we stick as close as possible to the template. If you are curious about our SWIP you can find it at nwswd.org under the "About Us" tab.

In legislative news, the Vermont legislature only passed one bill that had major implications to waste management in Vermont. However it has a big impact on HHW collection. I have included a summary of H484. In short it will increase what the state pays us towards the collection of unwanted pesticides, gives extra time for the state to set up its statewide Extended Producer Responsibility program for household products that contribute to Household Hazardous Waste, and finally moves more paint and paint related wastes into the current "PaintCare" program. All three of these steps will have positive impacts on the expense of our HHW programs.

Here at the NWSWD office we continually discuss what services we provide, how we provide them, and what's possible in a way that is both site specific and regional. We strive to expend our resources wisely, avoid duplicating efforts and services, and cover gaps/fulfill needs. We are always on the lookout for feedback on District services and programs and the facilities and resources needed to provide them. Please let us know your thoughts and if you have any questions.

6.4.25 NWSWD Board Meeting Finance Report

- 1. The FY24 Audit Draft was received in late April and sent back for correction in May after review. While the bottom line was correct, they had understated trash income and overstated surcharge income. Spoke with the auditor, thought we were good, redone draft came back with trash income overstated and surcharge income understated. It has been sent back again. I've not paid the final balance (sm) for the FY24 audit and will not until it's correct. I have however made the first payment for for our final year of the contract for the FY25 audit.
- 2. An RFP for audit services will be going out in June. I've had Tony making cold calls to accounting firms to gauge the interest in municipal audit services, and will review who has shown any interest in the past so we have a really good list to mail direct as well as listing it on our website and with the VLCT Classifieds. As well our current auditors have sent notification that their services will increase in price.
- 3. Green Up Day was a success. The following towns participated in the tire disposal program over green up day.

Alburgh - 32

Georgia - 78

St. A. Town - 48

Swanton - 75

Sheldon - 75

- 4. I'd like to begin discussions about health care options for FY27. BCBS will see another large increase of around 15%, MVP has asked for an increase of around 7.5%. I'm hoping to get together a committee meeting within the next few months to begin these discussions.
- 5. The final payments for the two grants helping to support our building project have been submitted and total a little over 40K. I have drawn down the majority of our bond funds to date with just a little over 100K. I will be providing within the next few days (couldn't have it ready for pkg distribution), a full recap of what has been paid, from where and to who. We can discuss and review at the meeting.
- 6. We have purchased a new Used U-Haul Ford Truck for composting. John will provide details.
- 7. I've given an accrual to the P&L showing what I believe will happen between now and June 30th. It reflects a loss of appx 38K, we had some large expenses... I am hoping that I've overstated some expense or understated some income.
- 8. Drop Off Site Income has been good and users have been up. A quick comparison of Total DO Income.

Provisions of H.484 of Interest to SWDMA

H.484 An act relating to miscellaneous agricultural subjects

On Friday, May 30, the House and Senate gave final approval to H.484 An act relating to miscellaneous agricultural subjects. The bill will soon be delivered to the Governor's desk. We are hopeful he will sign it. The bill includes three provisions of importance to solid waste districts:

→ Pesticide registration fee and disposal funding study

Currently, every pesticide sold in the State must be registered annually with the Agency of Agriculture, Farms and Markets (AAFM). Registrants pay an annual fee of \$200 for each product registered. Of this amount, \$185 is deposited to the Pesticide Monitoring Special Fund and \$15 is deposited to the Agricultural Water Quality Special Fund. The bill establishes an additional \$50 fee charged to registrants of pesticide products that will be deposited to the Pesticide Monitoring Special Fund. This fee will be used to generate additional revenue for AAFM's support of costs incurred by solid waste management districts in disposing of obsolete and unwanted pesticides. The fee will be collected until an extended producer responsibility program for pesticides is implemented in the State that fully funds the collection of obsolete and unwanted pesticides. The Joint Fiscal Office (JFO) estimates this provision will generate an additional \$613,000 in revenue for the Pesticide Monitoring Special Fund in fiscal year 2026.

The bill also directs the Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets, in consultation with the Commissioner of Environmental Conservation, to study potential funding sources to reimburse solid waste management entities for all costs associated with the collection and disposal of unwanted or obsolete pesticides at municipal hazardous waste collection events. The study will also consider the viability of an extended producer responsibility program for pesticides, as well as other disposal options. The Secretary is required to submit a report to the committees of jurisdiction by December 15, 2025.

→ Household Hazardous Waste Collection Plans

H.484 amends the current Household Hazardous Waste EPR program to require the Secretary of Natural Resources to adopt and administer certain household hazardous waste collection plans if manufacturers fail to meet their obligations to submit these plans to the State under 10 V.S.A. § 7183 by July 1, 2025. If manufacturers comply by the deadline, ANR will not be required to take this action.

Under current law, manufacturers must run collection programs for specified household hazardous waste, with ANR overseeing and approving their plans. The proposed language in H.484 will act as a contingency: if manufacturers do not submit their required plans by July 1, 2025, ANR must implement one on their behalf. The State will recover its costs by charging each manufacturer a prorated share of plan administration and oversight costs, plus an additional charge equal to 10% of the plan's total cost. This charge will be deposited in the Solid Waste Management Account within the Waste Management Assistance Fund to support pollution prevention and hazardous waste reduction grants for

municipalities and small businesses. Based on information provided by ANR, the fiscal impact of this section on Solid Waste Management Account revenue is likely de minimis. ANR expects the potential imposition of a 10% charge will incentivize full manufacturer compliance, meaning it is unlikely to be triggered. To the extent this expectation holds, no additional State revenue or costs will be generated by this provision in fiscal year 2026 or beyond.

→ Paint Product Stewardship Program

This bill also amends requirements under Vermont's Paint Stewardship Program, which provides environmentally sound disposal of postconsumer architectural paint free of charge to the individual disposing of the product.

Under current law, architectural paint cannot be sold in the State unless its producer or a nonprofit stewardship organization acting on its behalf implements a Paint Stewardship Program plan approved by the Secretary of Natural Resources. Vermont's Paint Stewardship Program is run by PaintCare, a nonprofit stewardship organization. The costs incurred by PaintCare to transport and process postconsumer paint are covered by a paint stewardship assessment fee paid by the producer, which is passed on to consumers as an addition to the product's purchase price.

This bill makes several changes to the Paint Stewardship Program:

- Change how the paint stewardship assessment for architectural paint is set from approval by the Secretary of Natural Resources to specification in statute. The bill codifies the existing stewardship assessment fee for architectural paint into law (currently it is in rule):
 - \$0 for each half pint or smaller;
 - o \$0.65 for amounts greater than a half pint but less than one gallon;
 - \$1.35 for amounts greater than one gallon but less than two; and
 - o \$2.45 for amounts greater than one gallon but less than five.
- Renames the Paint Stewardship Program the "Paint Product Stewardship Program" (Program) and expands its requirements to producers of aerosol coating products, coating-related products, and nonindustrial coatings.

The bill also requires the Secretary of Natural Resources to recommend stewardship assessment fees for architectural paint and other paint products to the committees of jurisdiction by December 15, 2025. The new Program requirements for non-architectural paint products will then take effect on July 1, 2026. The bill also requires producers of aerosol coating products, coating-related products, and nonindustrial coatings to do the following:

- Submit a stewardship plan for the expanded Program to the Secretary by July 1,
 2026
- Report annually to the Secretary on Program operation beginning on March 1, 2027
- Aerosol coating products, coating-related products, and nonindustrial coatings are not currently subject to a stewardship assessment fee. Once the expanded Program

requirements take effect, consumers will pay a paint product stewardship assessment fee on the purchase of these products.

The amount of this assessment fee will be set by the General Assembly after receipt of the Secretary's fee report. This fee will increase the purchase price that is subject to sales tax, thus increasing the sales tax collected by the State on these products. The amount of this increase will depend on future sales of these products and the amount of the stewardship assessment fee. For reference, the existing fee schedule on the sale of architectural paint generated approximately \$994,000 in revenue for PaintCare's Vermont program in calendar year 2024. Because stewardship assessment fees are subject to the six percent Vermont sales tax, this sum generated approximately \$60,000 in sales tax revenue over that period.
